1 "See the Need" Accessibility Walk



Partner with blind/VI neighbors to audit sidewalks, crossings, signage, lighting, contrast and QR-only information, then share constructive recommendations with the town.

2 Accessible Menu Project



Help local restaurants offer large-print, Braille and/or accessible digital menus. Start with five and recognize participating businesses as Vision Accessible Partners.

3 "What's in Your Way?" Day



Invite blind/VI community members to identify small barriers Lions can actually fix, then spend a service day removing them.

4 Sensory StoryWalk



Build a StoryWalk with Braille/large print, tactile elements, high contrast and audio by QR/NFC for a park or library.

5 Little Free Accessible Library



Create a lending station with large-print books, tactile children's books, audiobooks/players, magnifiers and accessible games.

6 Vision-Friendly Community Kits



Assemble low-cost kits for senior centers or libraries with magnifying sheets, bold-line paper, large-print calendars, high-contrast labels, bump dots, task-lighting info and local low-vision resources.

7 "One Drawer at a Time"



Help older adults with low vision add tactile dots, large-print labels, contrast markings and phone accessibility settings. Partner with an OT or low-vision professional when possible.

8 Accessible Game Night



Adapt bingo, cards, trivia and board games with large print, tactile markings, Braille and audio — then play together. Inclusion, not charity.

9 Community Help Day



Offer participant-directed help with non-sensitive visual tasks such as reading expiration dates, identifying pantry items, organizing clothing by color or sorting selected mail.

10 Tactile Art Project



Work with blind/VI artists or students to create public art with raised textures, Braille, shapes and audio description.

11 "Describe It!" Accessibility Challenge



Learn useful visual description, then help community organizations make flyers, museum displays, historic photos and social images more accessible.

12 Accessible Emergency Preparedness



Create emergency information in Braille, large print, high contrast and accessible electronic formats, plus tactile labeling kits, with local emergency partners.

13 Sports Without Sight Day



Host beep baseball, goalball, blind soccer or another adapted sport — with blind/VI athletes teaching the Lions.

14 "Books You Can Feel" Build



Make tactile books for children with visual impairments using fabric, textures, raised shapes, and simple Braille/large-print text.

15 Accessible Holiday Project



Try beeping-egg hunts, tactile/Braille Santa letters, tactile Halloween activities or audio-described light displays; build one into an annual signature project.
